ALL OF OUR MUCHNESS

At the beginning of the V'ahavta, we are told to love God with all our heart (b'chol l'vavcha), all our soul (uv'chol nafsh'cha), and all our might, or muchness (uv'chol m'odecha). It occurred to me recently that these actions correlate beautifully with flow, a term coined by psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi (CHEEK-sent-me-HIGH-ee) to describe a state of being in which we are fully immersed in what we are doing.

Entering into flow can be a little elusive. It often seems to just happen. I'm wondering if these words of the V'ahavta can be used towards flipping the flow "on" switch; whether we can engage different parts of ourselves in something step-by-step, eventually gath-

ering our full forces and focusing them towards a particular point. Starting with our heart, or our soul, or our left pinky, and eventually working towards the muchness, the everything.

I'm thinking about this in particular as we enter the season of High Holy Days. High Holy Days can be a new beginning, a chance to look at the book of our life and think about the next chapter. Our liturgy talks about being written into that book, but the reality is that we do a lot of our own writing. Could that be done in flow? Could we do it with all our heart, all our soul, all our... everything? What would that look like?

We're going through tough, often overwhelming, times. It may feel like we don't have a lot to put into thinking about our lives or the next year. That's okay. It doesn't have to be a lot. It can be just a moment here and there, a moment in which we fully engage all parts of ourselves and let everything else fade into the background.

High Holy Days can provide opportunities for that. Closing our eyes during the sounding of the shofar, breathing it in so that it undulates through us, thrumming in all the corners of our mind and body. Focusing on a word or phrase in the prayer book, and marinating ourselves in its texture and meaning. Gazing at the waters during tashlich, visually imbibing their ebb and flow. Reaching out and being of deep service to someone or something.

Csikszentmihalyi talked about losing oneself in a transcendent purpose. In this New Year, may we each find moments of such transcendence, infused with our heart, soul, and muchness.

Where You Are Known

There's a Berkeley cafe I've been frequenting for five years or more. Once or twice a week I stop in for chai; they make the best chai. Today, the line was long when I got there and even though I was wearing a hat and a mask and my sunglasses, the owner saw me through a pile

of people and started making my chai - because I am a regular. And he knows me.

When I talk about Beit Sefer Phyllis Mintzer, I extol the blessings of being small - the first of which is that everybody knows you. And your parents, and your pets. To be known, to be seen, is the key to a deep sense of belonging. And isn't that the kind of place your synagogue should be? That "third place" (after home and school/work) where you are anchored in community life? I often tell prospective families how much I love watching our kids interact at recess. It's like a group of neighborhood kids or cousins. Everyone finds their way in, or comfortably to the side. Kids play across ages. They try out different activities depending on their mood or the group energy. And they build a seamless community that includes everyone.

This impulse to inclusion crosses generations. While parents are not required to lean in, most do and they are robustly welcomed and made to feel at home. And the kids are the same. They fluidly welcome new kids, accept each other's foibles, work together, and make space for each other. Yes, there are moments of friction. And when they happen students are reminded that everyone matters. The contributions of a first grader are as important as those of a sixth grader. And we practice honoring each other in real time. Yes, Beit Sefer is creative and

engaging and forward-thinking and queer-positive and joyfully experimental in all the ways that make learning compelling. And what makes us magical is being a small community where everybody matters and is seen and honored for exactly who they are.
