#### THE SACRED DARKNESS

"G!d is the creator of light and darkness." - Yotser Or (Creator of Light) prayer

As Chanukah approaches, it's been hard to find joy when my heart is in such anguish over the terrible suffering in Israel, Gaza, and here at home. It's tempting to equate our fear, grief and anger with the fact that we are entering the darkest time of the year - the season with the shortest days and the longest nights. But I would like to offer another perspective about darkness.

It is no accident that our Chanukah season falls around the winter solstice, the darkest time of the year. Like so many other traditions, ancient and modern, we celebrate with light and fire in the midst of winter's darkness. Chanukah comes at the darkest part of the year and we, literally, bring light into the dark time.

This time also feels "dark" as in difficult, scary, sorrowful, and we don't know when our metaphorical light will return. But I have been exploring the language of darkness and I feel a need to resist equating darkness with negativity and fear. It's a big task, since associations of darkness and blackness with fear are embedded deep within our psyches. Black, lesbian Zen master Zenju Manuel writes in her book, *Opening to Darkness*: "darkness and blackness have been rendered negative, fearful ... The use of darkness ... stand[s] for almost anything unwanted or anything mysterious."

But can we dismantle the association of darkness and negativity? The children's book *God's Holy Darkness* reads, "...Creation began in the dark ... Creation is God's work done in holy darkness ... We are reminded of the size of God's creation through the boundless beautiful black of outer space ... In the dark soil and the deep sea, we are reminded of God's love." We find holiness in darkness - after all, our holidays begin at sundown. Light and darkness are inextricably bound together, and are not even the polar opposites they are presumed to be. Darkness can be fertile ground for transformation. Jacob's all-night struggle with G!d led to his - and our - transformation into Yisrael. In darkness we are challenged to go to places unknown or unfamiliar, but if we aren't truly present to the darkness and we don't grapple with it as Jacob did, we miss opportunities for new ways of SOCIAL ACTION being.

Chanukah invites us into joy. But we cannot light enough candles in eight days, or in any amount of time, to banish our grief. Creating light does not excuse us from acknowledging our fears or allow us to turn away from the world outside our homes and our sanctuaries. And although the calendar tells us when the days will again become light, we cannot know when our hearts will again find relief. But rather than rushing this season to bring light because the darkness is frightening or makes us uncomfortable, this Chanukah, may we face darkness with bravery, even with wonder and openness and a sense of awe. And as we bless the light we create, let us pray for peace and safety for all of us - here, in Israel, in Gaza, and across the whole world.

#### OD LO AVDA TIKVATENU - OUR HOPE HAS NOT YET BEEN LOST

As I write in late October, the horrific events of October 7 are still fresh and overwhelmingly painful. And war continues. Where are we in December? At Sha'ar Zahav, many have family and loved ones living in Israel -

some of whom were killed or taken hostage in this largest massacre of Jews since the Holocaust. We all feel the pain of having our people targeted and so brutally killed. Some of us have Palestinian friends, loved ones with loved ones in Gaza or the West Bank. And the world's empathy for our Jewish pain has, as it has so often, felt inadequate.

Our communal and individual pain is deep; we struggle to express and address it. We

grapple with the distinction between antisemitism and valid criticism of Israel's policies. We struggle with the pain inflicted on us as Jews, and we struggle with the pain being inflicted in our name. We grapple with the distinction and relationship between Hamas and Palestinians, and between Israel, Israelis, and the Israeli government. How can we articulate the complexities of context and history to move towards peace?

Our views of a prudent path towards peace differ. We are unified in grief, and disparate in our responses. Still, as Jews, we all turn to Sha'ar Zahav as a place to come together, for comfort, community, and prayer.

At Sha'ar Zahav, we have talked and struggled together to find common ground

Meet Diana, Juan and Chelsy, and Camila and Mariajose, who fled Columbia under duress ... Meet Andru, a young gay man without a supportive family, who fled Venezuela under duress.

Some are LGBTQ+, some are straight; some speak English, most don't; they are people of all colors - black, brown, white. What do they have in common?

All have been accompanied by members of Sha'ar Zahav's Social Action Committee, as

part of the Nueva Esperanza Accompaniment Team (NEAT) program sponsored by Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity (IM4HI). Our Sha'ar Zahav team walks beside these asylum-seeking immigrants as they meet the challenges of a new culture and language, and recover from their traumatizing experiences. We assist them in finding and utilizing local resources for housing, food, clothing, schools, language classes, transportation, and legal services.

The Torah commands us in thirty-seven places to love the stranger. We get to know one another so they are no longer strangers. We show them that they are welcome into and part of the community and they are not alone.
