**CANTOR’S MESSAGE**

In the very beginning, on the first day of creation, God said: “Let there be light”; and there was light. Three days later, on the fourth day, God created the sun, moon, and stars. It is three days – three whole days – from the moment light is created until the celestial bodies that make light are created. Somehow, between the first and the fourth day, there was light, but not yet that which actually makes physical light in the world. How is that? What is this light that existed before there was that which could make light?

Light, scientifically, is a kind of visible electromagnetic wave which emits from certain sources (such as a light bulb) and which can then bounce off material objects, enabling us to see them. It is a factor – both literally and metaphorically – in perceiving, probing, and understanding the universe around us.

But light is not just about physically seeing. Light – in Hebrew “*Or*” or “*Ora*” – refers to the physical light: of things such as sun, moon, stars, luminescent jellyfish and fireflies. And it also refers to metaphysical, or spiritual light: *ner mitzvah*, the light of instruction; *or chayim*, the light of life; *or panim*, a bright cheerful face; *ora v’simcha*, light and joy.

It is the combination of both – of what we can perceive and understand physically with what we can perceive and understand spiritually – which leads to what we can call enlightenment. The non-physical light comes first in the Torah. Not, I think, because it is necessarily more important, but perhaps to help highlight that it is non-physical perception that helps bring meaning to the physical. With our eye we can perceive a flower; with our spirit we can find it beautiful. But not only can we find it beautiful, we can help make it beautiful. We are created *b’tzelem Elohim*, in God’s image, and as such, have the ability to create, to bring light. We can create lights of teaching, joy, and healing (life). And we can also create, and expand upon, lights of perception in the world. We can combine the spiritual with the physical, helping to illuminate matters deep and broad for ourselves and others. We can bring the light.

Let there be light.

## VA'AD UPDATE

The Va'ad (SZ Board) is hard at work at this time of year developing our budget for fiscal year 2025, and we are wrangling with our growing needs and the challenge of increasing our revenue. We greatly appreciate all individual and community efforts and donations to support

our work. I hope you will keep this in mind as you consider your Rainbow Campaign contribution. We are continuing our education and conversations on our community and individual relationships with Israel, the tragic situation in Israel and Gaza, and rising anti-semitism in the Bay Area and beyond. We also have Va'ad members representing us in working to protect the rights of transgender and gender non-conforming people. As a Va'ad, we grow closer and find comfort as we work together to address today's challenges and celebrate our successes, continuing our oversight and leadership.

for the current 2023-2024 school year. In January, longtime member and SZ history expert Ron Lezell gave a talk about the early days of the congregation and the school, then led us on a multigenerational walking tour of the Castro. We checked the camera shop, Twin Peaks, and other notable sites off on our low-tech paper maps. We were fascinated to learn that what is now Dolores Park was once the largest Jewish cemetery in the Bay Area! This history will provide a backdrop for the students' research into their own family names and stories. As their work takes shape, they will decide what type of culminating project would be the best way to present their learning to each other, their families, and the community. I can't wait to discover what's in store!

Speaking of curiosity, I'm usually asked,

"Why 'Rabbi Q?'" I like to be called "Rabbi" by students and community members, but the conversations about "Lisa" versus "Rabbi Lisa" versus "Rabbi Levenberg," and all the related issues around age, gender, formality, status, etc are both tired and tiring! So I'm trying out Rabbi Q instead. Plus, "Weird Barbie" was taken.

## SHA'AR ZAHAV / WELCOME HOME!

### THE WELCOME HOME PROJECT

Responding to community need, Sha'ar Zahav has launched a 30-month pilot, the "Welcome Home Project." WHP will provide programming and support for the trans and gender non-conforming (TGNC) community; increased capacity for our Journey to Judaism (J2J) conversion program; and materials, resources and training to help synagogues and other Jewish institutions better serve transgender and gender non-conforming people. Rabbi Reuben Zellman, with their deep expertise in transgender and gender non-conforming identities, is developing and overseeing this program. You'll be hearing more from Rabbi Reuben about WHP in the coming months. The Welcome Home Project has been developed and funded in honor of our beloved members Paul J. Cohen z"l and Ray

K. Bernstein z"l, who cared deeply about Jewish inclusion. Funding for WHP comes in part from a generous legacy gift from Ray, donations from SZ congregants in Ray and Paul's memories, and generous seed funding from Menorah Park, where Paul was a longtime Board member and past Chair. Paul and Ray were so beloved in our community. The Welcome Home Project has been created from that love and will keep their names alive in our community.

## HEALTH & SAFETY AT SZ

In November 2022, SZ created a new Health & Safety (H&S) Committee to continue the work of our prior Reopening and Security Task Forces. H&S's goals: to ensure the health, safety, and security of our community by developing policies and procedures, evaluating and securing resources, and providing guidance and partnership to SZ leadership.

In its first year, H&S managed the evolution of SZ's health protocols as COVID moved from pandemic to endemic, including practices at High Holy Days and all events at 290 Dolores. We have been guided by public health advice and by the principle of *kol Yisrael aravim zeh b'zeh* – all Jews are responsible for one another. We also evaluated and began implementing options for First Aid/CPR; developed procedures for real-time decision-making in response to threats; reviewed greeter procedures; and established closer connections to national and local security-related organizations.

This work was put to the test after October

7, as Jewish communities everywhere have faced increased antisemitism and threats of violence. In response, we now have professional security plus volunteer greeters at 290 Dolores during scheduled services, public events, or Beit Sefer classes. Security will intervene if an incident occurs, but our greeters assess who should be admitted, in as warm and welcoming a way as possible, while keeping us safe. We're also applying for grants to fund upgrades to our security systems.

Health, safety, and security matters are complicated and rarely have one "right" answer; meeting our community's needs involves balancing many factors. H&S members take this responsibility seriously, and we appreciate the trust the community has placed in us. 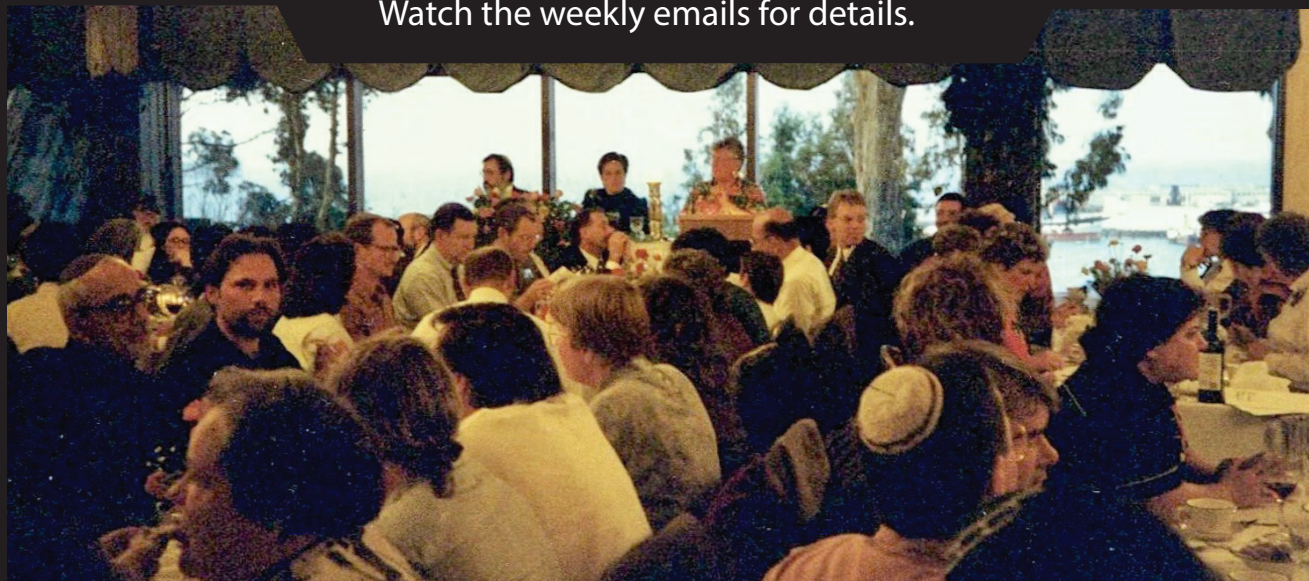
