When someone does something praiseworthy in Jewish life, we often say “yasher koach” – may your strength continue. The idea is that whatever they have done took some strength to do, and we wish the person continuing strength so that they can do more.

Going into this Fall, I have been thinking that we could all use some of that kind of strength: Strength to navigate an increasingly uncertain world; strength to discover and be true to ourselves; strength to be understanding with and open to others who might see things very differently than we do; strength to help us push forward and strength to take a break when needed.

Strength comes in a myriad of forms. Some examples from our ancestors include: Abraham, who found strength to question God; Rebecca, who found strength to envision and enact a different future; Joseph, who found strength to forgive; Moses, who, feeling himself lacking in speech, found strength to stand up to Pharaoh and speak for the whole people; Yael, who found strength to strike with a hammer; and Hannah, who found strength to persist in asking for her heart’s desire.

These were not their only strengths – these were just the particular ones that arose according to the needs of the moment. I believe that, as they each found different kinds of strengths, so can we each discover and utilize different kinds of strengths within ourselves.

Strength can be quiet or loud, soft or tough, durable or fragile. It can lead us to new paths, or help us revisit those well-trodden. It can arise in the most mundane tasks as well as the herculean. It can be surprising or unexpected, appearing suddenly or morphing over time. And it can be shared, reinforced, lent and borrowed as needed.

So, as we recite our wishes and apologies and hopes and dreams coming into the new year, know that you have strength. Your own, particular, beautiful, very special strength. And the strength of all those around you and everyone who came before you.

May all our strengths continue.

BEYOND APPLES AND HONEY, OR "CHILDREN ARE PEOPLE"

Janusz Korczak, a Polish Jewish pediatrician and children's rights activist, wrote, "Children are not the people of tomorrow, but people today. They are entitled to be taken seriously. They have a right

to be treated by adults with tenderness and respect, as equals..." Treating children with tenderness and respect is, luckily, now the norm in most educational settings. All too often, though, we educators think of children as delightful, if generic, vessels, for us to fill with information that will be important to the people that they will someday be.

Sometimes, this produces activities that may be interesting or fun, but don't lead

anywhere: "On Rosh Hashanah, we eat apples and honey. How many apples can you find in this picture?"

Here at Beit Sefer Phyllis Mintzer, I've noticed the deep, authentic respect that our faculty has for children. Whether in Ila's storytelling, Marty's discussions, or Andréa's hands-on creating, our students are, first and foremost, treated like people. We assume that, like us, they have spiritual needs, substantive ideas, and perceptive questions, even if they have less life experience than we do. During these High Holy Days, our students will explore the same big questions that we do: How do we prepare ourselves? What does it mean to start fresh? How can I become a better version of myself?

And then, of course, we eat apples and honey.

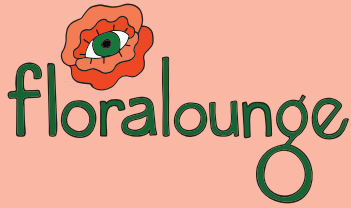
