REMEMBERING OUR FOUNDER, DANIEL CHESIR

Our beloved founder, Daniel Chesir, died on October 31. The Torah portion on the Shabbat eve when Daniel died was “Lech L’cha,” when Avram is told to leave his parents’ house and everything that is familiar for a new life in an unknown place. Daniel did exactly that when he left his Orthodox family in Brooklyn and moved to California over 50 years ago. Traditional Jewish ritual life was always a part of who he was, although he was headed on a very different path.

In 1977, Daniel, Bernard Pechter z”l, and Shamir Durst founded Sha’ar Zahav as “the gay synagogue of the Golden Gate: a non-sexist, multi-traditional kehillah.” Daniel wrote: “...after our whole lives being scorned by other synagogues and often by our families, we wanted a Jewish community where we could celebrate our lives and relationships.”

Rabbi Yoel Kahn said: “Daniel ... was self-integrated and self-actualized as a queer Jew before any of those words were in common usage, always believing in and living out these essential dimensions of himself with uncompromising integrity.”

Daniel’s mark is everywhere at SZ. But he and our other early visionary leaders also made a major impact on LGBTQI inclusion in the then ambivalent Reform movement, pushing them to accept synagogues like SZ into the fold and changing the way LGBTQI people were represented in the movement’s publications. Daniel served as regional president of the Reform congregational arm, leading them towards greater inclusion. We are indebted to Daniel and our other leaders for transforming the way the Jewish world views LGBTQI people.

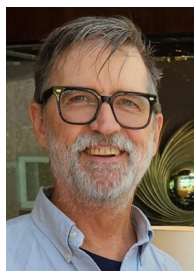
But SZ was Daniel’s self-proclaimed greatest accomplishment: “being a founder of Sha’ar Zahav has, without a doubt, been the most significant activity of my life. It has become an organization surpassing anything I could have dreamed of.”

One of our SZ prayers ends: “When I am gone and have left only my name, I know that I will be remembered here.” Daniel will be remembered here. And his legacy is that he built a *kehillah k’dosha*, a sacred community, which ensured that countless other people will be remembered long after they are gone as well. Daniel will be remembered as a groundbreaker and a visionary, but also as a kindhearted soul who lived his life authentically, and paved the way for so many of us to follow in his footsteps.

I am proud to be a member of a community that has been a change agent. We have brought change to the Reform movement and to the nationwide Jewish community. We created a synagogue specifically for the LGBTQ community when that was a radical act. We addressed the AIDS epidemic, Sanctuary efforts, and reparations. We are working to support trans/gender-nonconforming communities and to provide access to all who need it. I wish I had space for all our other achievements – the impact of this synagogue has been profound and palpable.

As we look towards the incredible milestone that is our 50th anniversary, I hope that we celebrate and honor our past, and also ensure that future generations of Sha'ar Zahav members are able to carry all of these stories into our future.

It all started during Covid when my husband Alex and I read about a poignant and hilarious documentary by Rachel Mason that focused on her modest Jewish parents who were also proprietors of a bookstore that produced and sold gay pornography in West Hollywood. It was streaming on Netflix and we had an in with the filmmaker. How could we resist?

From that initial movie, we decided to form a movie and theater chavurah – to view films and plays that were available online – and then discuss them among ourselves. Since that start in May 2020, we have viewed and discussed over 36 films and plays. They include comedies and tragedies, new and older productions, and are in English – or sometimes not: “God of Vengeance” was in Yiddish.

While not all productions are explicitly Jewish, many are – and several are produced in Israel. We explore how or whether they represent Jewish values, evaluate artistic values and generally leave our conversation thinking more highly of the film or play. Of course, we also ask “Is it good for the Jews?” That question seems to summon the greatest debate.

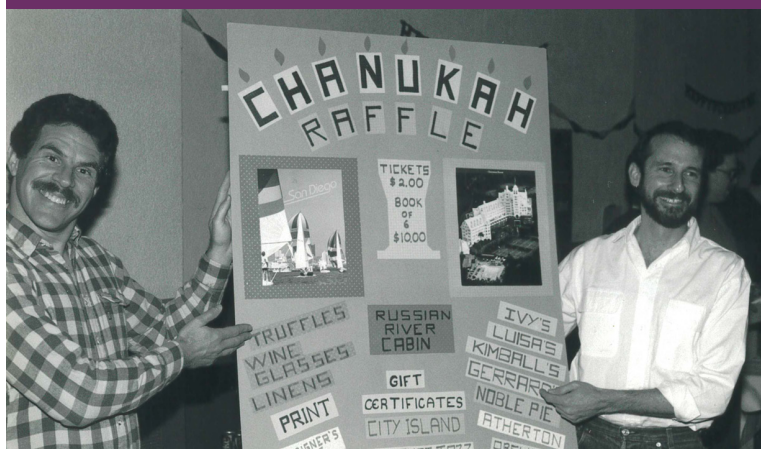
